Minutes of Meeting held on Wednesday 15th November 2023 at 7.00pm – at Upwey and Broadwey Memorial Hall

#### 1. PRESENT & APOLOGIES:

**Present:** Chair – apologies. Councillors: Mr Charles Norman, Mr Graham Brant, Mr Roger Holehouse, Mr Alec Walters, Mrs Suzanne Mcsevney, Mr John Trent

1.1. The clerk informed the council that Cllr Webster was unable to attend the meeting and had sent apologies. Cllr Norman, as vice chair of the council, agreed to take the chair for the meeting.

## 2. DECLARATION OF INTERESTS AND REQUESTS FOR DISPENSATIONS.

- 2.1. No declarations were made.
- 3. **PUBLIC PARTICIPATION** no members of the public were present.
- 4. **MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING** of 16th August 2023. The minutes were accepted by the council and signed by the Chair.

### 5. MATTERS ARISING

5.1. It was generally agreed that any matters arising were covered under the agenda.

## 6. DORSET COUNCIL UPDATE

6.1. Mr Tarr provided the council with a brief update.

## 7. PLANNING, ROADS AND FOOTPATHS

7.1. <u>Land north of Littlemoor Road.</u> There was some discussion about street names within the parts of the development currently under construction, which would mostly continue the Anzac connection of the existing street names in Littlemoor. Cllr Trent noted that with this in mind, there was a lack of first peoples, Aboriginal or Maori names within the currently planned streets and wondered whether this could be considered in the future.

Cllr Brant observed that there was lots of groundworks and associated mud in the vicinity of Turnstone Close where services to the new development were all being connected. Cllr Mcsevney observed the lack of planting at the rear of the commercial site, although it was noted that this land was still for sale.

- 7.2. <u>Major planning application Whitcombe stables.</u> There was some discussion of the ongoing issues related to this site.
- 7.3. <u>A352 at Whitcombe</u>. There was some discussion of the trees suffering from ash die back in the cutting at Whitcombe. Cllr Walters noted that due to the topography of the cutting, it was almost certain that the dead trees, if left alone, would fall into the road. Mr Tarr acknowledged that there was a significant problem with ash die back and a massive exercise to cut back affected trees in other areas. He undertook to speak with the highway engineers to see if anything could be done.

7.4. South Winterborne stream – discharge of sewage. Cllr Norman told the council that while he had been informed of the date and time of a meeting to discuss this matter in Martinstown, he did not have a location for the meeting and had been unable to locate where it was happening. Mr Tarr replied that he had been able to attend the meeting with representatives from Martinstown and Winterborne Abbas parish councils. Winterborne Abbas in particular was very keen to make progress with the issue, as apparently were the Duchy. The suggestion was for the siting of reed beds or some other ecological means of filtration both above and below Martinstown.

There was some discussion of methods of filtration and the state of the river at Monkton. Cllr Norman was of the view that reed beds would be broadly satisfactory, but currently there was sewage discharge from the Martinstown pumping station even when the river was dry, meaning it was going into the ground which was illegal. He was happy to maintain a friendly approach with Wessex Water but was of the view that this particular matter needed to be dealt with and that the Environment Agency should be putting pressure on Wessex Water to do so.

It was generally agreed that Cllr Norman be able to formally represent the council regarding matters pertaining to the South Winterborne stream should the need arise.

- 7.5. <u>Environment agency reporting of flooding</u>. The clerk outlined the contents of this document and a related meeting, which were noted.
- 7.6. <u>A35 parishes group</u>. The clerk outlined the contents of this document, which were noted.
- 7.7. 2024 elections. The clerk explained to the council that elections will be held on Thursday 2nd May 2024 for Dorset Council, town and parish councils, and the Dorset police and crime commissioner. While elections for this council are usually uncontested, councillors must ensure they stand for election should they wish to continue on the council. He undertook to write to councillors when he received more on this in the new year.
